Mary: Jane, if you don't give it up I will put you outdoors and leave you out there by yourself. I wonder what happened to Tom. (Another funny noise.)

Bill: No girls, honest. It wasn't me.

Mary: Let's forget about whatever noise you heard. I'm hungry. Did anyone bring any food?

Bill: I brought some junk food.

Jane: I love junk food. Let's eat it all now.

Mary: Will we save any for Tom?

Bill: Let's eat it all before Tom comes back. He will never know we had any.

Mary: Bill, you're an awful person but I'm too hungry to argue. What kind of things did you bring?

Bill: Oh, lots of stuff - chips, bars, and candy. Something sweet for you two sweet things to eat.

Mary: That's enough Bill, let's eat.

(One hour later.)

Jane: Boy, that food was good.

Bill: I feel sick and I'm just about froze.

Mary: Me too. Bill, it's been almost two hours and Tom is not back yet. I'm getting worried about him. Bill, maybe you should go look for him.

Bill: Me? Go out there by myself?

Jane: Yes, Bill, you're a man and you should go look for Tom.
If it was you out there Tom would go look for you.

(Tom enters with firewood.)

Bill: Tom, I was just coming out to look for you.

Jane: What took you so long, Tom?

Tom: I had to chop down a tree and cut it up with my axe. I was also talking to some people from down the river and they invited me down for something to eat.

Bill: What?

Tom: I'm sorry guys, but I couldn't say no. I couldn't resist the offer.

Mary: That's what we get for eating all of the junk food.

Tom: You ate it all?

Jane: And we all got a stomach ache.

Tom: Did you guys have a visitor while I was gone. (Ghost quietly creeps across the room.)

Mary: Nobody was here. Why?

Tom: When I was leaving I am sure I saw someone go into the house.

Bill: In here? (A funny noise.)

Jane: There's that noise again. Oh, I'm so scared. (A louder noise. Bill runs away from the noise, trips over a junk of wood and Jane runs tripping over Bill.)

Bill: (Moaning) Jane, why don't you watch where you are going. Boy, you must weigh a ton. Jane, please get off me.

Tom: Will you two please get up and act like mature people. The noise may only be the wind.

Mary: Tom, did you have a good look at the person who was coming in here when you were outside.

Tom: Not really. But come to think of it the person was all dressed in white.

Bill and Jane: White? (They look at each other.) A ghost.

Mary: Tom, will you please talk to them, they are driving me crazy.

Tom: Bill, Jane, there are no such things as ghosts.

(Ghost enters room and quietly takes firewood without anyone seeing it.)

(Tom turns to pick up the firewood. He looks around the room looking at the others.)
